California Alliance for Minority Participation:

CAMP sponsors undergraduate science and engineering majors who are interested in pursuing a research experience. This internship program will fund UCSB undergraduates from under-represented groups in science, technology, engineering and mathematics for a 10 week summer research experience.

Interns will gain first-hand experience in scientific investigation in a dynamic, collaborative research environment. They will develop and complete a project with a UCSB faculty member and a lab mentor who will provide training and support.

In addition to research, the interns will also participate in weekly group meetings to develop oral presentation skills, attend special seminars and present their results at an endof-summer poster session.

Getting started:

Because students must find a faculty sponsor and a project before formally applying, it is important to start early. If you already have a research interest in mind, visit with and talk to faculty members whose research interests you. Tell them you are going to be applying for the summer CAMP program and are looking for a faculty mentor to work with. If you are unsure what research interests you, visit faculty websites and read their research description to see who you might like to work with. In addition, contact the CAMP coordinator, Dr. Julie Standish, for guidance and help with finding a faculty mentor. Once you have chosen a faculty mentor, meet with them several times to discuss the project that you will be working on. You will need this information for your project proposal that you, with the help of your mentor, will write and submit with your application.

Program Details:

- The Summer CAMP program will run from June 26 to September 1, 2017.
- Approximately 10 internships will be awarded in all areas of science, technology, engineering, or mathematics.
- The stipend for undergraduate interns is \$3,000 total for 10 weeks at 30 hrs/week.

Student Eligibility:

This program is open to any science, engineering, or mathematics undergraduate student who meets the following requirements:

- Will be enrolled as a sophomore, junior or senior at UCSB in Fall 2017
- US citizen or permanent resident
- In good academic standing
- Member of an under-represented group: blacks/african americans, native americans/alaskans, pacific islanders, latinos and latinas

Application Process:

An internship application must include the following components (see application form for more details)

- 1. Completed application form (attached)
- 2. Statement of interest explaining your research interests, background, and how this internship fits into your future goals.
- 3. One-page resume with a history of all your work and laboratory experience.
- 4. One-page project proposal that you have arranged with your research sponsor.
- 5. An unofficial transcript
- 6. A letter of recommendation

- 1. A completed application form--see below
- 2. A statement of interest explaining your research interests, background, and how this internship fits into your future goals.
- 3. A one-page resume with a history of all your work and laboratory experience.
- 4. A one-page project proposal that you have arranged with your research mentor. The proposal should include:
 - * Background information about the research area
 - * A specific discussion of the activities you will be doing in your research project
- 5. An unofficial transcript
- **6.** A letter of recommendation from a course instructor/TA or employer (preferably one who is familiar with your scientific skills). This letter can be from the same professor who will be sponsoring your research. Letters can be sent by email to camp@mrl.ucsb.edu and at most one page long.

All items may be sent by email. Acceptable file formats for attachments are Microsoft Word and Adobe Acrobat (pdf). Unofficial transcripts can be scanned in and converted to pdf file form, or downloaded from online grade reporting systems.
